- SUBJECT: UPDATED THERAPEUTIC DAY TREATMENT PROGRAM AUTHORIZATION PROCEDURES

DISCUSSION:

The purpose of this memorandum is to provide designated staff responsible for reviewing, processing and authorizing therapeutic day treatment prior authorization requests with updated procedural information.

Therapeutic day treatment is a Medicaid-funded resource available to eligible children between the ages of 3 and 6 at imminent risk of out-of-home placement. The therapeutic day treatment program provides intensive, daily interventions and early education often in lieu of traditional child care for children experiencing emotional and/or behavioral issues. Services are intended to prevent out-of-home placement and return children being served to traditional child care settings as soon as possible. In addition, the service may be appropriate for a child who is already in out-of-home care who is in need of this therapeutic service. The program is only available to children who meet ALL the eligibility criteria. (See attached <u>Program Description and Eligibility</u> Requirements)

After determining that a child meets ALL the eligibility criteria for the program and determining that this service is needed, the service provider may request prior authorization for an initial period of up to 9 months. Prior Authorization requests and required eligibility verification documentation should be submitted to the local Children's Division liaison for approval. The local Children's Division liaison will review the requests

What's Inside: Updated Therapeutic Day Treatment Program Authorization Procedures and supporting documentation and, if approved, forward to Central Office for final processing and submission to Infocrossing Healthcare Services which is the fiscal agent for MO HealthNet.

The Children's Division must have a case open at the time of the initial prior authorization request, however, it is no longer required that the Children's Division's case remain open throughout the therapeutic day treatment authorization period. This allows the child to continue to receive therapeutic day treatment services, if needed, in instances when it may not be necessary to continue to keep the Children's Division's case open. It should be noted that once the Children's Division's case is closed, the provider will continue to be able to bill Medicaid for the remainder of the authorization period as long as the child remains Medicaid eligible, but no longer be able to bill for absences.

If the provider believes and recommends continuation of therapeutic day treatment services beyond the current authorization period, the provider must submit another prior authorization request, consistent with the requirements at the time of the initial prior authorization request, and only provide the additional service when reauthorized by the Children's Division. Reauthorizations will only be granted when the Children's Division has a case open.
