House Bill 1111 reduced the time limit allowed for individuals to receive healthcare coverage under the Extended Transitional Medical Assistance program from twenty-four (24) months to twelve (12) months (13CSR 70-4.090 effective July 1, 2002). Our records indicate your eligibility under this program will now end

Eligibility may exist for MC+ healthcare or other medical assistance programs if the following apply:

- You have a physical or mental disability which is expected to last at least 12 months;
- You are pregnant;
- You are blind; or
- A change in circumstances occurred, such as a change in income.

Please contact your MC+ Service Representative if any of the above apply so we may evaluate eligibility for other MC+ healthcare or medical assistance coverage.

If you believe this action is wrong, you have until **June 28, 2002** to request a hearing. If you request a hearing by this date, your benefits will continue pending the results of the hearing. You may request a hearing by mail, by telephone, or in person through your local Division of Family Services at the address or phone number listed on this notice. If you request a hearing, you will be notified of the time and place of the hearing. At the hearing, you may present your information yourself, or your may be represented by your own attorney or by other persons who know your situation. If you do not have an attorney, or cannot afford one, you may be able to get help from Legal Aid or Legal Services in your area. You have the right to bring witnesses to testify at the hearing and to question witnesses who appear at the request of the Division of Family Services.
