FACTS - You Should Know

On July 1, 2003, the Division of Workforce Development (DWD) will begin providing you case management during your participation in training and/or employment activities. The transition of employment and training activities from Division of Family Services (DFS) to DWD will bring a range of employment opportunities and social support systems together in a coordinated, seamless fashion.

- Beginning July 1, 2003, you may be referred to Division of Workforce Development (DWD) for Case Management Services.
- You are required to cooperate with Workforce Development if you are receiving Temporary Assistance.
- After July 1, Division of Workforce Development will contact you for an initial appointment. Continue to participate in your current work activity until contacted by Division of Workforce Development.
- If you are in a work component, school, or volunteer site, and your case has been transferred to Division of Workforce Development, they will pay transportation reimbursement and other supportive services.
- Your Case Manager with Division of Family Services will still determine eligibility for Temporary Assistance, Food Stamps, Child Care and Medical Assistance.
- Report changes affecting your Temporary Assistance and other programs' eligibility to your Case Manager at Division of Family Services.
- After July 1, 2003, report any changes in your work component, school, or volunteer site to Division of Workforce Development.
